Government Debate Day Requirements

A Debate Day is a time for *you* to discuss, question and answer some of the major issues in American society. In order for this to be *your* discussion, *you* must be knowledgeable of the topic at hand. My hope is to merely serve as a moderator and questioner on these days.

You are expected to participate in class in an intelligent and mature manner. You will be graded based upon the quantity and quality of your input. Please make note of the attached Rubric. You will be graded on your appearance, speech, conduct, knowledge and preparation.

Acceptable debate topics may be found on my webpage. Other topics may be approved upon request.

During the course of the year, each student is expected to:

- 1. Choose and research at least one current issue largely debated in American society.
- 2. Prepare an argument for either supporting a change or maintain the status quo.
- 3. Prepare an opening statement clearly outlining your stance on the issue
- 4. Prepare a typed-outline written by you that summarizes at least 3 primary reasons supporting your policy position on the issue.
- 5. Present a persuasive argument against an opposing viewpoint in front of the class.
- 6. Offer relevant rebuttals to criticism of one's chosen policy proposal.
- 7. Provide knowledgeable and relevant answers to questions regarding one's views.
- 8. Turn in all notes, papers, etc. used during the debate
- 9. Prepare a closing statement summarizing your stance on the issue

Assessment:

- 10. 50 points for the debate performance
- 11. 25 points for a written outline

Format:

- 12. Opening statement by both students identifying their stance on the issue.
- 13. Student A's 1st point, Rebuttal by Student B, Last word by Student A.
- 14. Student B's 1st point, Rebuttal by Student A, Last word by Student B.
- 15. Repeat as needed.
- 16. Closing Statement
- 17. Question & Answer
